Introduction

This action list is being provided in advance of the publication of formal (section 19) flood investigations. It is subject to change. It includes specific pieces of work which are in addition to the usual duties of risk management authorities (RMAs). It does not include all actions taken during and in the immediate aftermath of the events, such as the closure of roads and the set-up of rest centres. Further details on RMAs and their roles, and how they work in partnership, can be found in the Leicestershire Local Flood Risk Management Strategy. The following actions will be monitored at Leicestershire Flood Enquiries Partnership discussion meetings, as coordinated by the Lead Local Flood Authority.

Henk Property Flood Resilience Repair Grants	LCC LLFA	Two grants were awarded from a possible eleven eligible properties. Formal communication was sent to properties formally reporting their flooding on two occasions. With the scheme promoted at both Drop-in Sessions and the Parish meeting.
Review of LCC LLFA comments to the Blaby Local Plan.	LCC LLFA BDC LPA	LLFA has contacted BDC to request further time to review the newest version of the draft Local Plan, as more details on housing allocations have been put forward, including new parcels south of Mennecy Close.

Mennecy Close Riparian Culvert Investigation	LCC LLFA, LHA and STW	LHA completed the inspection of chambers and sections within highway control on 13 th August 2025. Including dye testing to confirm connectivity and cleansing of sections within the vicinity of Mennecy Close. No issues on visible sections and no evidence of silting/damage to structure. LLFA issued Riparian letters on 3 rd July 2025 to homeowners of the open sections of the watercourse to remind them of their duties to keep it maintained and clear, ready for winter. Culvert added to the critical culvert list for potential.
Exploring opportunities for Natural Flood Management	LCC LLFA	PFR has already been determined to be a cost-effective option. LLFA have discussed options with interested members of the community and with landowners. Further scoping and partnership working on long-term schemes with RMAs and stakeholders are planned for 2026 onwards.
Sewer network	STW	Severn Trent has extended the scope of the local planned cleansing programme to include additional areas. Further engagement has also been ongoing with local commercial properties to raise awareness of fats, oils and greases (FOG) and how they can impact the network.
Highway Network	LCC LHA	Ongoing investigation into severely flooded areas of the critical road network, including Winchester Road, Willoughby Road and Leicester Road to identify any feasible improvements. It is not possible to protect high-risk roads from flooding.
