## 2025/26.050 Housing development updates (if any)

The following updates were received and discussed:

#### a. Keepers Farm

There was nothing to discuss.

## b. Peatling Road

Responses from the feedback forms from the Parish Council consultation regarding Peatling Road had been compiled in preparation for the Parish Council forming its response once the planning application is submitted.

## c. Cosby Road

There was nothing to discuss.

#### d. Foston Road

It was noted that no response had yet been received from Miller Homes to the invite from the Parish Council for a representative to attend a future meeting in order to provide an update on the maintenance and construction plan for the Foston Road development. It was resolved to resend the invitation.

It was also resolved to follow up with Blaby District Council to request confirmation of which conditions were required to be agreed with the developer before works starting. It was noted that the developers were currently working on site as early as 6.30am as the hours had not yet been formally agreed with the District Council.

## e. Willoughby Road

There was nothing to discuss.

#### f. Gillam Butts

It was noted that no response had been received to the Parish Council's enquiry to the developer requesting a timeframe for works to begin on the Gillam Butts development.

## g. Solar Farm

It was noted that Blaby District Council had undertaken an independent visual impact assessment which had been received and circulated to all Councillors ahead of the meeting. It was resolved to submit the following additional comment to Blaby District Council:

The Parish Council notes that the BDC Visual Impact Assessment has been received and the recommendations therein. Based on the recommendations, the Parish Council would expect there to be revised drawings submitted to the District Council and for there to be further public consultation. The revised drawings should also include further details of the proposed substation and its location within zone 2.

Whilst the Parish Council appreciates that the District Council has commissioned this survey and notes that a site visit was made on 21st July 2025, the Parish Council is very concerned that it only appears to be an appraisal of the applicant's original assessment. Furthermore, there is no independent photographic evidence of the site and its detrimental visual impact on the surrounding area. The survey has been conducted during the summer when the shrubbery and trees are in full leaf, whereas an independent survey should have been carried out during the autumn/winter months when the trees are bare and the detrimental visual impact would be more evident.

The Parish Council also has grave concerns about the lack of clarity on the extent of cleansing the site, as referred to in the Environment Services' response to the consultation. The Parish Council considers it to be totally inadequate to meet the seriousness of the contamination that resulted in the prosecution of the landowner by the Environment Agency. The land must be thoroughly cleansed prior to the start of the installation of the solar farm. The Parish Council is concerned that the application is still being progressed without any remedial action yet being taken by the applicant or a satisfactory method for the cleansing put in place and agreed with the Environment Agency.

# h. <u>Correspondence forwarded by County Councillor G Cooke regarding the road infrastructure</u> through Countesthorpe

The copy correspondence to County Councillor G Cooke which had been received from a resident proposing alternative road routes to the current planning applications to the south of Countesthorpe was discussed.
